- ❖ Children, birth to 21, who meet the definition of Intellectual Disability, Developmental Delay, or Autism Spectrum Disorder.
- ❖ Provide Mental Health case management services to children birth to age 21.
- ❖ Identify parent concerns, children's needs, and family strengths.
- ❖ Support and assist families in accessing services and referrals.
- ❖ Attend school meetings, doctor's appointments, and evaluations with families.
- ❖ Coordinate and monitor treatment plans and services.
- ❖ There is **no cost** to families with Katie Beckett or MaineCare.

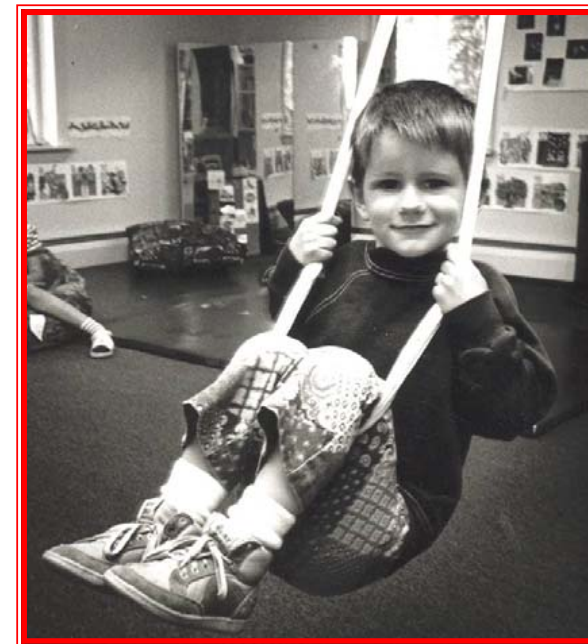

# History

Special Children's Friends, Inc. was organized by a group of parents and professionals who saw the need for therapeutic summer programs for children with special needs. SCF successfully ran their programs for six summers until local school districts developed similar programs. Subsequently, SCF received community support for a nationwide publishing project to develop literature for children. This project was successfully completed in 1987.

In 1988, SCF focused its efforts on developing a year-round early intervention program. In February, 1989, SCF was funded by the Bureau of Children with Special Needs.

SCF is a non-profit corporation and looks to grants and fund-raising to augment its funding.
